


## Participatory Study Guides

### **To the Hebrews** (144 pages)


### **Revelation** (152 pages)

This book strives to provide a basis for lay students to understand how translations are produced. Mr. Neufeld writes about the



An honest look at the difficult pages in the Old Testament and how they can strengthen our faith and understanding of God and how He works in the world.



### Daily Devotions of **Ordinary People – Extraordinary God** (388 pages)




### **Directed Paths** (104 pages)


### **Not Ashamed of the Gospel: Confessions of a Liberal Charismatic** (136 pages)

What is the good news? If the gospel that Jesus taught is so good, why are Christians so bad? How can Christians relate to people of other faiths or of no faith at all? Bible teacher Henry Neufeld wrestles with these issues in this book. This is not a book of theology. It is his personal testimony of what Jesus means in his life, and how one can be both a serious, committed Christian and a strong proponent of diversity and dialogue. Henry's understanding of Christianity is built around the incarnation. If God can cross the gap between the infinite and the finite to experience life with us, surely we can cross the gap between ourselves and our fellow human beings. “You are never more God-like than when you open your heart's door to another person. The more different they are, the more God-like that action is,” he says in describing how Christians should seek to build relationships.



### **Identifying Your Gifts and Service** (84 pages)

This book provides a process for discovering and activating spiritual gifts in your congregation. It is not a typical scientific survey designed to discover what kind of personality you have, what you feel like doing, or even what your talents are. Instead, it is a process designed to help a church congregation discover God's gifts and leading in their lives.




### **Identifying Your Gifts and Service – Small Group Edition** (135 pages, forthcoming)

This workbook adds teaching and exercises for small groups. It forms a good follow-up for churches who have used the Identifying Your Gifts program in their congregation, but need to follow-up for new members.

### **Consider Christianity, Volume 1: Evidence for the Bible** (206 pages) and **Consider Christianity, Volume 2: Evidence for the Christian Faith** (214 pages)

Elgin Hushbeck, Jr. discusses the evidence that convinces him that the Bible is reliable and that Christianity is a rational and relevant religion. This is the second, revised and expanded edition of Elgin's book, and has been split into two volumes due to size.



Christians and those interested in investigating the evidences that undergird Christianity will want to read and study these two volumes.

**I Want to Pray** booklet

This approach to prayer is experiential and participatory. It calls on you to get involved personally in prayer, to track your experiences and to let that experience show you the way. There are no formulas here, just a simple, conversational approach.

**When 3 to 8 Gather** (aprx. 120 pages, forthcoming))  
This book began when two men of God, diverse in background, came together with a common purpose to encourage the Church to promote small groups for prayer and study. It is the prayer of **Rev. Perry Dalton and Henry Neufeld** that your church will grab hold of God's powerful tool of prayer and communion together which will build relationships with God.


